The members welcomed the report as presented by Ms. Jean Ryan raising a number of queries including programme of works for Clara; Badgers lane; lighting in Westwood Grove; footpath on left hand side going into Ferbane; timeline for URDF schemes; Collins lane pedestrian crossing and link with cycle lane; Spollenstown pedestrian crossing update; public consultation for Clara town Plan; enhancement works on New Road.

The motion was passed on the proposal of **Clir. T. McCormack**, seconded by Clir. S. O'Brien. In the interest of interdepartmental collaboration, the members further requested the Department for Housing, Local Government and Heritage also receive a copy of the Notice. It was further requested at the Notice of Motion be circulated to all Local Authorities as it was felt this issue is not unique to Tullamore.

Cllr. T. McCormack

"That Tullamore MD engage with the Department of Enterprise and IDA to develop a second IDA park in Tullamore, as the current IDA Business Park at Srah is at capacity."

The motion was passed on the proposal of **ClIr. T. McCormack**, seconded by ClIr. S. O'Brien. it was noted the existing IDA park is in an excellent location with a great work force, however options for new companies needs to be provided as the existing park is close to capacity and a new focus has the potential to attract foreign direct investment.
