# 3. Planning and Development Act, 2000 as Amended, Part 8 of the Planning and Development Regulations, 2001 as Amended

On the proposal of Cllr. J. Leahy, seconded by Cllr. E. Dooley, the members resolved to adopt the Planning and Development Act, 2000 as Amended, Part 8 of the Planning and Development Regulations, 2001 as Amended, for the proposed development of Leabeg to Lough Boora Visitor Centre Cycle and Walking Link.

## 4. Section 85 Agreement

On the proposal of Cllr. E. Dooley, seconded by Cllr. J. Clendennen, the members resolved to adopt the Section 85 Agreement with Westmeath County Council for the Dublin to Galway Greenway.

#### 5. Finance

On the proposal of Cllr. N. Feighery, seconded by Cllr. T. McCormack, the members approved the Overdraft Accommodation 2023, in the amount of €15m.

## 6. Roads – R420 Update

Cllr. F. Moran, Cathaoirleach, advised the members that this agenda item is deferred until the next meeting.

## 7. Just Transition

Mr. S. Duclot, D.O.S. advised the members on the Department's response to their request for an update on Offaly based projects for Strands 1 & 2 of the Just Transition funding, as circulated to the

members on the agenda. He noted that their response outlines the three priorities of the fund; Employment & Enterprise, Training and Community Transitioning Supports. The fund has supported 56 projects, comprising of €22.1m in grant funding, with a further €50m to be mobilised, this has resulted in an estimated 178 direct jobs and 999 indirect jobs.

He advised the members that observations from the Commission are being addressed by the Department and formal adoption of the plan by the European Commission is anticipated by the end of 2022. He noted the draft operational plan is available on the Department website and it supports three priorities: Enhancing and diversifying the economy of the territory, supporting innovative approaches to regeneration and repurposing of land and transitioning to smart and sustainable local mobility.

He noted the process is managed by EMRA and communities and Local Authorities will have time to prepare their submissions for open call at the end of 2023.

The members joined with Cllr. F. Moran in thanking Mr. S. Duclot for all his work, noting he has been pleasure to deal with and they wished him the best in his new role as Director of Services in Tipperary County Council.

Mr. S. Duclot thanked members for their support, kind words and engagement during his time in Offaly County Council.

Ms. A. Delaney joined with the members in thanking him for his dedication and she acknowledged his contribution through the Covid-19 pandemic.

### 8. Monthly Management Report

Ms. A. Delaney, Chief Executive, brought the members attention to the Monthly Management Report as circulated with the agenda. She invited the members to attend the launch of the book Traditional Architecture in Offaly on Wednesday 30<sup>th</sup> November at 5pm in the Áras. She welcomed the recent launch of a Climate Action project, Moby Bike Hire in Tullamore, and the launch of the Participation of Women and People of Diversity in Local Government. She informed the members of the new electric vehicle fast charging infrastructure in the Áras carpark and the Machinery Yard in Tullamore.

She welcomed the recent visit of Minister Darragh O'Brien to the opening of new housing projects and the progress of social housing in the county. She advised the members of the Community Forum response in relation to the Ukrainian refugees arriving in Ireland. She highlighted the engagement event in TUS Athlone between TUS & Midland LEOs under the Midlands ICT Cluster and the Learning Gate project with TUS launched on 26<sup>th</sup> October in The Junction. She noted the programme will work towards the provision of Higher Education programs in Offaly. She noted the Arts, Library and Finance services updates in the report for their information.

The members thanked Ms. A. Delaney for her comprehensive report.
