EXTENSION TO ST. MARY'S CEMETERY, JKL STREET, EDENDERRY, CO. OFFALY

In accordance with Part 8 of the Planning & Development Regulations, 2001, as amended, Offaly County Council hereby gives notice of the proposal to construct an extension to St. Mary's Cemetery, JKL Street, Edenderry, Co. Offaly.

For a period of 4 (four) weeks, beginning on Wednesday, 05th April, 2023, plans and particulars of the proposed extension scheme will be available for inspection and/or purchase at a fee, not exceeding the reasonable cost of making a copy, during normal opening hours at the offices of Offaly County Council, Áras an Chontae, Charleville Road, Tullamore, County Offaly, R35 F893 and Edenderry Municipal District, Edenderry Town Hall, Edenderry, Co. Offaly, R45 K766 during normal opening hours.

For a period of 6 (six) weeks, beginning on Wednesday, 05th April, 2023, submissions or observations with respect to the proposed extension scheme dealing with the proper planning and sustainable development of the area in which the development would be situated, may be made in writing to The Director of Services, Environment and Water Services, Offaly County Council, Áras an Chontae, Charleville Road, Tullamore, County Offaly, R35 F893.

The proposed extension scheme has been the subject of an Appropriate Assessment screening in accordance with the EU Habitats Directive and the Planning and Development Act 2000 as amended. The Appropriate Assessment screening concluded that the proposed extension scheme would not be likely to give rise to significant or indeterminate impacts on any European site.

Offaly County Council has carried out a preliminary examination of the nature, size and location of the proposed extension scheme and has determined that the proposed extension scheme will not have significant effects on the environment and does not require an Environmental Impact Assessment.

Within 4 weeks beginning on Wednesday, 05th April, 2023, any person may apply to An Bord Pleanála for a screening determination as to whether the proposed extension scheme would be likely to have significant effects on the environment.
