

Main concerns are : Flood Plain, Archaeological features, small limited number Cluster Development, Impact on existing amenities.

- We agree with the council's view of balanced growth which is sustainable and appropriate to scale, size and character of the village maintaining its RURAL status.
- We are pleased that the strategy supports sustainable development of the open countryside as Killeigh is known for its historical and archaeological features & the current development plan mentions these in detail – ie the 6th century monastery, 13th century Augustine Convent & Franciscan Friary, I would like to see these added to the new draft as they seem to have been omitted.
- We feel Killeigh needs more cluster style compact residential zoning in keeping with the rural character of the village, limiting growth to ensure no added pressure on the existing water scheme, sewage system & infrastructure , environmental etc
- On the plan there are two Opportunity Sites identified. One of which already has planning granted for residential houses.
- We have major concerns regarding the existing area of flood plain that is clearly marked on the existing plan and can personally confirm that in the 11 years living in the exact area marked as flood plain we have been witness to flooding & water damage every winter, more housing in this area in particular could potentially have extreme negative outcomes.
- We agree with the expansion of existing service provision from the council. In particular, the National School is at full capacity and any further residential development in the area will have a serious effect on the school's ability for extra numbers.
- We agree with the councils view to upgrade, consolidate and expand the public lighting and footpath network in the village.
