NATURE OF APPLICATION: Request for Declaration under Section 5 of the Planning & Development Act 2000, as amended as to whether or not the retention of a new entrance onto a public road where the carriage width is less than 4m is or is not development and is or is not exempted development.

LOCATION OF DEVELOPMENT: Clondoolusk, Portarlinton, Co. Offaly.

WHEREAS a question referred to Offaly County Council on 31/1/2022 has arisen as to whether or not the retention of a new entrance onto a public road where the carriage width is less than 4m At Clondoolusk, Portarlinton, Co. Offaly. is or is not development and is or is not exempted development under the Planning and Development Act 2000, (as amended).

AND WHEREAS the Planning Authority, in considering this declaration request, had regard particularly to-

- (a) Sections 2, 3 and 4 of the Planning & Development Act 2000 as amended.
- (b) Planning and Development Regulations 2001 -2018, Article 6 (1) and Article 9
- (c) Planning and Development Regulations 2001-2018, Schedule 2, Part 1, Class 40

AND WHEREAS Offaly County Council has concluded that –

The proposed works **Is Development and IS Exempted Development**

NOW THEREFORE Offaly County Council, in exercise of powers conferred on it by Section 5 (2) of the Planning and Development Act 2000, as amended hereby decides that the retention of a new entrance onto a public road where the carriage width is less than 4m At Clondoolusk, Portarlinton, Co. Offaly **IS DEVELOPMENT AND IS EXEMPTED DEVELOPMENT**

1. Proposal

The question has arisen as to whether or not the retention of a new entrance onto a public road where the carriage width is less than 4m is or is not development and is or is not exempted development.

2. Location

The site is located in the open countryside of County Offaly in the townland of Clondoolusk, Portarlington, Co. Offaly.

3. Relevant Planning History:

PL2/87/94: Permission **Granted** to Joseph Walsh for the construction of a house and septic tank subject to 12 conditions

PL2/20/631: Permission **Granted** to Joe & Catherine Walsh for retention permission for first floor storage area with dormer windows and extension to eastern side of existing dwelling. Also retention of domestic shed to rear of the site. Planning permission for construction of a 'granny flat' to the side of existing dwelling and all associated site works subject to 7 conditions.

4. Legislative Context

Planning and Development Act 2000 (as amended)

- Section 2
"works" includes any act or operation of construction, excavation, demolition, extension, alteration, repair or renewal and, in relation to a

protected structure or proposed protected structure, includes any act or operation involving the application or removal of plaster, paint, wallpaper, tiles or other material to or from the surfaces of the interior or exterior of a structure.

- Section 3(1)

In this Act, "development" means, except where the context otherwise requires, the carrying out of any works on, in, over or under land or the making of any material change in the use of any structures or other land.

Planning and Development Regulations 2001 (as amended)

• Article 6

(1) Subject to article 9, development of a class specified in column 1 of Part 1 of Schedule 2 shall be exempted development for the purposes of the Act, provided that such development complies with the conditions and limitations specified in column 2 of the said Part 1 opposite the mention of that class in the said column 1.

Schedule 2, Part 1, Class 9

CLASS 9 The construction, erection, renewal or replacement, other than within or bounding the curtilage of a house, of any gate or gateway.

Conditions and Limitations:

The height of any such structure shall not exceed 2 metres.

• Article 9(1) - Restrictions on exemption.

Development to which article 6 relates shall not be exempted development for the purposes of the Act—

(a) *if the carrying out of such development would—*

- I. *contravene a condition attached to a permission under the Act or be inconsistent with any use specified in a permission under the Act,*
- II. *consist of or comprise the formation, laying out or material widening of a means of access to a public road the surfaced carriageway of which exceeds 4 metres in width,*
- III. *endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard or obstruction of road users,*
- IV. *except in the case of a porch to which class 7 specified in column 1 of Part 1 of Schedule 2 applies and which complies with the conditions and limitations specified in column 2 of the said Part 1 opposite the mention of that class in the said column 1, comprise the construction, erection, extension or renewal of a building on any street so as to bring forward the building, or any part of the building, beyond the front wall of the building on either side thereof or beyond a line determined as the building line in a development plan for the area or,*

pending the variation of a development plan or the making of a new development plan, in the draft variation of the development plan or the draft development plan,

- V. consist of or comprise the carrying out under a public road of works other than a connection to a wired broadcast relay service, sewer, water main, gas main or electricity supply line or cable, or any works to which class 25, 26 or 31 (a) specified in column 1 of Part 1 of Schedule 2 applies,*
- VI. interfere with the character of a landscape, or a view or prospect of special amenity value or special interest, the preservation of which is an objective of a development plan for the area in which the development is proposed or, pending the variation of a development plan or the making of a new development plan, in the draft variation of the development plan or the draft development plan,*
- VII. consist of or comprise the excavation, alteration or demolition (other than peat extraction) of places, caves, sites, features or other objects of archaeological, geological, historical, scientific or ecological interest, the preservation, conservation or protection of which is an objective of a development plan or local area plan for the area in which the development is proposed or, pending the variation of a development plan or local area plan, or the making of a new development plan or local area plan, in the draft variation of the development plan or the local area plan or the draft development plan or draft local area plan,*
- VIII. consist of or comprise the excavation, alteration or demolition of any archaeological monument included in the Record of Monuments and Places, pursuant to section 12 (1) of the National Monuments (Amendment) Act 1994, save that this provision shall not apply to any excavation or any works, pursuant to and in accordance with a consent granted under section 14 or a licence granted under section 26 of the National Monuments Act 1930 (No. 2 of 1930) as amended,*
- (viiB) comprise development in relation to which a planning authority or An Bord Pleanála is the competent authority in relation to appropriate assessment and the development would require an appropriate assessment because it would be likely to have a significant effect on the integrity of a European site,*
- (viiC) consist of or comprise development which would be likely to have an adverse impact on an area designated as a natural heritage area by order made under section 18 of the Wildlife (Amendment) Act 2000.*
- (viii) consist of or comprise the extension, alteration, repair or renewal of an unauthorised structure or a structure the use of which is an unauthorised use,*

- (ix) *consist of the demolition or such alteration of a building or other structure as would preclude or restrict the continuance of an existing use of a building or other structure where it is an objective of the planning authority to ensure that the building or other structure would remain available for such use and such objective has been specified in a development plan for the area or, pending the variation of a development plan or the making of a new development plan, in the draft variation of the development plan or the draft development plan,*
- (x) *consist of the fencing or enclosure of any land habitually open to or used by the public during the 10 years preceding such fencing or enclosure for recreational purposes or as a means of access to any seashore, mountain, lakeshore, riverbank or other place of natural beauty or recreational utility,*
- (xi) *obstruct any public right of way,*
- (xii) *further to the provisions of section 82 of the Act, consist of or comprise the carrying out of works to the exterior of a structure, where the structure concerned is located within an architectural conservation area or an area specified as an architectural conservation area in a development plan for the area or, pending the variation of a development plan or the making of a new development plan, in the draft variation of the development plan or the draft development plan and the development would materially affect the character of the area,*

(b) in an area to which a special amenity area order relates, if such development would be development:—

- I. of class 1, 3, 11, 16, 21, 22, 27, 28, 29, 31, (other than paragraph (a) thereof), 33 (c) (including the laying out and use of land for golf or pitch and putt or sports involving the use of motor vehicles, aircraft or firearms), 39, 44 or 50(a) specified in column 1 of Part 1 of Schedule 2, or*
- II. consisting of the use of a structure or other land for the exhibition of advertisements of class 1, 4, 6, 11, 16 or 17 specified in column 1 of Part 2 of the said Schedule or the erection of an advertisement structure for the exhibition of any advertisement of any of the said classes, or*
- III. of class 3, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 or 13 specified in column 1 of Part 3 of the said Schedule, or*
- IV. of any class of Parts 1, 2 or 3 of Schedule 2 not referred to in subparagraphs (i), (ii) and (iii) where it is stated in the order made*

under section 202 of the Act that such development shall be prevented or limited,

(c) if it is development to which Part 10 applies, unless the development is required by or under any statutory provision (other than the Act or these Regulations) to comply with procedures for the purpose of giving effect to the Council Directive,

(d) if it consists of the provision of, or modifications to, an establishment, and could have significant repercussions on major accident hazards.

5. Proposal by Applicant

The applicant wishes to ascertain to whether or not the retention of a new entrance onto a public road where the carriage width is less than 4m is or is not development and is or is not exempted development.

6. Appropriate Assessment

A screening exercise for an appropriate assessment has been carried out and it is concluded that the development is unlikely to have significant effects on any European sites. Please see attached report under Appendix A.

7. Evaluation

Question: Is the following works considered as Development?

It is considered that the proposal constitutes 'development' as defined by Section 3(1) of the Act.

Question: Is the following works proposal considered as Exempted Development?

It is necessary to consider whether the development complies with the limitations set out under Class 9:

Article 9 – Restrictions on exemptions

Relevant considerations set out below:

As stated above:

9. (1) Development to which article 6 relates shall not be exempted development for the purposes of the Act— (a) if the carrying out of such development would—

(i) contravene a condition attached to a permission under the Act or be inconsistent with any use specified in a permission under the Act,

The proposed development would not contravene a condition attached to a permission (i.e. PL2/87/94 and PL2/20/631).

(ii) consist of or comprise the formation, laying out or material widening of a means of access to a public road the surfaced carriageway of which exceeds 4 metres in width,

(iii) endanger public safety by reason of traffic hazard or obstruction of road users,

The Declaration request has been referred to the Area Engineer Office for comment in respect of the above limitations who has clarified via email that *'the road at this location is less than 4m and the entrance has sightlines of over 90m, therefore it is not a traffic hazard.'*

(vi) interfere with the character of a landscape, or a view or prospect of special amenity value or special interest, the preservation of which is an objective of a development plan for the area in which the development is proposed or, pending the variation of a development plan or the making of a new development plan, in the draft variation of the development plan or the draft development plan,

The proposed development would not interfere with any designations.

(ix) consist of the demolition or such alteration of a building or other structure as would preclude or restrict the continuance of an existing use of a building or other structure where it is an objective of the planning authority to ensure that the building or other structure would remain available for such use and such objective has been specified in a development plan for the area or, pending the variation of a development plan or the making of a new development plan, in the draft variation of the development plan or the draft development plan,

The proposed development is not restricted by any objectives of the Planning Authority to ensure that the building or other structure would remain available for such use.

8. Conclusion

It is recommended that the applicant is advised that the development as described in the application is development and is exempted development.
