Climate Action Environment Water & Transportation

ENVIRONMENT

Climate Action Community Climate Action Fund

Community Climate Action Fund (CCAF) programme progresses towards interim drawdown stage for some of the 19 successful community groups who are receiving 100% funding towards their climate projects. Offaly received €444,000 in Phase 1 and it is anticipated that a similar amount will be allocated in Phase 2.

Climate Action Plan



November saw the signing of a multi annual Service Level Agreement between the Minister for Environment, Climate and Communication and OCC for Phase 3

(implementation) of the LA Climate Action Plans. This is a very positive step forward as the first multi-year SLA in relation to the Climate Action plan programme. This secures funding, to the amount of circa €29m nationally, towards Climate Action staff costs up to and including December 2028.

Bioeconomy

November saw an introductory event to the €5m Mount Lucas Circular Bioeconomy Aquaculture Initiative funded by the EU Just Transition Fund and DAFM. The Integrated Bioeconomy demonstration site at Mount Lucas IMTA (integrated multitrophic aquaculture/aquatech) site is a unique resource nationally for testing, developing and scaling new products.

Following the recent €5 million investment under the EU Just Transition Fund and

rooted in sustainability, the Co. Offaly site will function as both an in-action and visual representation of 'bio-economy', demonstrating how renewable living organisms such as rainbow trout can be utilized to produce food, energy and industrial based goods.

It is the first food/bioeconomy site that operates to zero waste, zero pollution and climate action principles where all activities can avail of digital technologies to improve efficiencies and opportunities. Offaly County Council is a linked partner to project partners TUS, University of Galway, University College Cork, Teagasc, Indigo Rock, Bantry Rearach Institute and Derilinx.



Energy

November saw the closing date for receipt of tenders for 'Multi Disciplinary Design Team' Architects/Engineers/M&E Service Engineers led consultancy services to design and cost deep retrofit measures for the organisation's two most significant energy using buildings i.e. Áras an Chontae and Aura Tullamore Leisure Centre, as part of the SEAI 50% match funding 'Pathfinder' programme. The four tenders received will

be evaluated and the appointment of the successful design team will follow.

The 3rd Annual Geothermal Summit, held at Dublin Castle during November, featured the recently drilled 1 km deep exploratory borehole in Tullamore was featured with a focus on geothermal feasibility in the public sector and economics across heat networks. Offaly County Council are actively working with GSI to explore the geothermal opportunities arising from this valuable sub-surface data, including the potential for district heating in Tulamore.

Environment Edenderry Clean Air Initiative - Targeted Air Quality Monitoring & Awareness Project

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) have been monitoring air quality in Edenderry and has raised concerns about the levels of sulphur and particulate matter in the area. To address these concerns, Offaly County Council, in collaboration with the Department of the Environment, Climate and Communications (DECC), developed a multifaceted initiative. The initiative strategy includes targeted measures such as:

- An air quality monitoring program in specific areas.
- A household survey and awareness program focusing on the burning of solid fuels to understand local practices.
- A community engagement initiative to raise awareness and encourage behavioural change.

Offaly County Council's Environment Department has successfully secured €80,000 in funding to implement these measures.

Air Quality Monitoring & Analysis Programme

16No. air sensors have been deployed in a variety of locations in Edenderry town. Notification of sensors going up has been publicised on our website and social media channels such as Facebook.

Our appointed Consultant, an expert on air quality, will also provide a report outlining the technical analysis of the monitoring programme. The data analysis on PM (particulate matter) levels will assist in gaining insights into the positive impacts of household energy retrofit measures along with identifying priority areas for intervention.

Awareness & Education Campaign centered around Household Surveys

Waste to Zero have been appointed to complete surveys of household, commencing on Friday the 15^{th.} November with the intention completing 200 Household surveys. This work is ongoing and Waste to Zero will complete report based on the outcomes of survey work carried out. The household surveys will provide details on fuel usage types, gauge householders' awareness of the impact of smoky fuel on health and the environment and use respondents replies to estimate potential increased uptake on low smoke fuels.

A leaflet will be given to all households visited in Edenderry. The leaflet contains detail on what a householder can do to



improve air quality in relation to heating their home. Approx 650 leaflets will be issued. Also, letters to 'missed' households and associated posters for public spaces and shop premises have all been designed, printed and issued.

Communications with Community

Offaly County Council has developed a strategy for the communications and awareness piece. The programme of events will run through the burning season up to March 2025.

The strategy centres around engagement with local schools. Offaly County Council has appointed the Rediscovery Centre from Ballymun to carry out workshops within schools in Edenderry town and surrounds. Token mementos will be issued with appropriate messaging from Ecoland/Klee Paper. The objective of this Air Pollution Education Workshops project is to link in with the pilot study on Clean Air in Edenderry being run by Offaly County Council. The proposed workshops, each spanning 90 minutes, will employ innovative and interactive methods to impart knowledge, skills, and values essential for improving air quality. Through activities, discussions, engaging collaborative learning, students will gain an understanding of the impacts of lifestyle choices and air pollution issues, both locally and globally. It is intended that this will improve the awareness air quality within the community.

Signage has been ordered for installation

at schools to inform and increase awareness of the issue of poor air quality and encourage parents not to idle. Final image to be agreed and sign off.



A local radio campaign will run from November through to March and the messaging for this piece is currently being finalised. Midlands Radio 3 will produce 3 different voice advertisements, which will run for 450 spots from Mid-November to end March.

Offaly County Council has completed a print media campaign to provide awareness and sharing of information with the public around the overall project. Advertisements were taken out in the Topic and Offaly Independent newspapers during November.

Edenderry! Change is in the air!

The targeted measures outlined in this strategy aim to bring about meaningful improvements in Edenderry's air quality. This approach addresses the immediate air pollution issues and lays the foundation for long-term environmental stewardship. Through community engagement, education, and data-driven interventions, the initiative seeks to foster a healthier environment for all residents of Edenderry.

Cemetery Committees

We currently work with 19 cemetery committees, two new committees were formed in 2024, and we look forward to working with them too. We are currently processing our cemetery committee grants, which should be dispersed by the end of the year. There are grants and assistance available form the CA-ENV-RW section and we welcome engagement from groups that are currently maintaining their local cemetery or planning on forming a committee to do that.

St. Mary's Cemetery, Edenderry

We are finalising the main works and the finishing touches to the extension with the contractor. The extension will provide an extra 300 burial spaces in the cemetery. Finalisation and landscaping will take place over the coming months.

RURAL WATER SERVICES - Capital



Applications for capital funding for from the Multi-Annual Rural Water Programme 2024 to 2026 were submitted

to the Rural Water Unit, Dept of Housing, in April, and all projects have been reviewed and passed stage 1 of the application process. Stage 2 of the application process involves consideration by the RWU's Expert Panel for consideration. The Rural Water Unit have recently announced their decision on a portion of the grants and we are advising the Group Water Schemes of that decision.

Subsidy

We have completed the payment of annual and advance subsidies to the Group Water Schemes. We have paid a total of €1,069,594.00 in subsidy support to 15 group water schemes.

Veterinary - Control of Dogs

So far this year we have cared for over 200 dogs in the dog shelter and on average 15% of the dogs are reclaimed by their owners, 15% are rehomed by the Care of Dogs Team and the other 70% are rehomed through animal rescue charities. The Control of Dogs team has also dealt with 82 complaints so far this year and has assisted AGS on a number of raids and have carried out inspections of premises under DBE and Animal Health and Welfare legislation. The team has also had a successful prosecution for a breach of DBE regulations.

Control of Horses

To date in 2024, we have dealt with 15 complaints, there have been no seizures to date.

TRANSPORTATION

R400 Peat Pilot

Works are now well advanced on the 2024 Peat Road Pilot on the R400 linking the M6 to Rhode village. Works are programmed to be completed by the 20th of December and have been funded by the Department of Transport and our Own Resources.



Birr North Distributor Road

A request to award the Contract for the Birr North Distributor Road has been approved by the Department of Transport. Works are due to commence onsite in early January 2025 with an estimated 7-month construction timeline.

New Default Speed Limit

The introduction of the new 60km/hr speed limit across all our County Roads will commence on the 7th of February 2025. As part of the preparatory works for this change a total of 692 new poles are being erected across our County by our Municipal District Staff. 1793 new signs will be erected prior to the 7thh of February. The current timeline for the implementation of the proposed new 30km/hr Urban Speed limit is the end of June 2025.

Public Lighting Maintenance

The following is a breakdown of the Public Lighting failures across the County. There are **193** faults on the system presently. **38** of these faults require third party intervention and as such cannot be repaired by the maintenance contractor. These anomalies are being addressed by the yearly public lighting capital program.

The current actionable faults amount to **155** <u>faults</u> <u>or 1.66 %</u> of the lighting stock. The breakdown of the **155** faults across each MD are as follows:

Housing Update

- There are 546 on the Social Housing Support List at the end of November 2024.
- A further 477 active tenancies are currently being supported under the Housing Assistance Payments (HAP) Scheme, 7 signed up for HAP and 21 exited from HAP in November.
- At the end of November 42 single people and 17 couples/families were being supported in emergency accommodation.
- The 2024 Rent Review of Social Leasing Scheme Tenants (Rental Accommodation, Short Term Leasing, Repair & Lease and Mortgage to Rent) and HAP Tenants is complete. Approx 662 rent letters were issued to Social Leasing Scheme and HAP tenants on Friday 28th June 2024, these rents became effective from the 13th July 2024. Just Transition

EU JTF Bioeconomy Demonstration Initiative Scheme (Total Support €10m)











This scheme was launched in 2023 and was devised to support the development of bioeconomy piloting and demonstration projects in the wider midlands area. The successful proposal would support the biobased sector to become climate neutral and

sustainable with enhanced circularity, while remaining competitive on the global market. This can be achieved by replacing non-renewable and fossil based raw materials and mineral resources with sustainably sourced biomass and biological waste to produce industrial and consumer goods.

Of the €10m awarded in 2024, Offaly was involved in a successful application led by the Technological University of the Shannon (TUS) entitled the Mount Lucas Circular Bioeconomy Aquaculture Initiative Project, which received €5m. The project has multiple partners – both academic and industrial – and was officially launched on 20th November 2024. It is the global first bioeconomy site for demonstrating and scaling new technologies, products and services for industry at the Mount Lucas peatland-based aquaculture site.



Offaly County Council supported the SEAI Sustainable Energy Communities Programme who were successful under the Just Transition Platform Groundworks Technical Assistance scheme. This partnership which is supported in the region by Roscommon and Longford County Councils and by the Eastern and Midland Regional Authority (EMRA), has been engaging with a European Technical Assistance team, from April 2024. The objectives are based on:

- Capacity building in the communityowned energy sector
- Accessing EU funding sources
- How to influence Irish government policy to be more supportive of community-owned energy
- Technical information and advice


The engagement recently culminated in a very successful 2-day capacity building workshop on 19th and 20th November 2024 in Tullamore which focussed on good practices for managing community projects, including funding options.



Heritage Week Awards

The annual Heritage Week awards were held on 15 November 2024 with Offaly winning awards in 4 of the 8 categories. James Scully was named the national Heritage Hero for his work over the last 50 years across a wide range of heritage interests including the Grand Canal, memorial recording, military fortifications and the Banagher Bronte connection.

Following their very successful Heritage Week project on the Shinrone Gown — we have supported **Shinrone Heritage** in their commissioning of a video on the subject which will also include interviews with the Keeper of Antiquities in the National Museum of Ireland who care for the original Shinrone Gown which is on exhibition there.



The Biodiversity Action Plan is prepared and will be presented to two SPCs before presentation to the County Council meeting for adoption early in 2025.

Heritage Council Biodiversity Action Plan Fund

The Draft Offaly BAP 2025- 2030 was prepared with funding from the Heritage Council BAP Fund during 2024 to the value of €10,000.

Local Biodiversity Action Fund (LBAF)

OCC led projects benefitted from €100k of LBAF funding during 2024 with 11 projects fully completed by the mid-November deadline for grant drawdown. Projects included:

- A further phase of the *Tullamore Living River Project* completed in collaboration with the OCC Climate Action Team.
- A full county *Hedgerow resurvey* (first completed in 2005).
- Alien Invasive Species Management of Himalayan Balsam and Japanese Knotweed.
- Development of eDNA surveys for the invasive Alpine Newt.
- **Community Biodiversity Action Support** and Training.
- Contribution to the National *Mayfly Survey*.

REGENERATION Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant

Offaly County Council announced significant progress in the delivery of the Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant, a critical initiative aimed at turning vacant or derelict properties into permanent homes or rental properties.

To date;

- 190 applications have been received since the commencement of the scheme
- 129 have been approved to commence refurbishment works
- 28 of which have now completed the grant process with approimately €1.5m in funding allocated


Under the scheme, applicants may receive up to €50,000 to refurbish a vacant property, with an additional top-up of €20,000 available for properties requiring structural repairs. Since the program's inception, the grant has facilitated the restoration of vacant properties in Offaly, making valuable contributions to both urban and rural communities across the County. Applications continue to be received, and staff are continuing to process applications in a timely manner. It is vital that all documentation required is submitted at the initial application stage or delays are inevitable.

Birr Vacant Property Information Evening

On Tuesday, 19th November, Offaly County Council, held an additional informative drop-in session to discuss the various supports available for bringing vacant properties back into residential use. The event took place from 6pm to 8pm in the offices of Birr Municipal District.





Representatives from Offaly County Council's Regeneration and Heritage departments were present, attendees were provided with comprehensive information on a range of supports, including:

- Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant
- Built Heritage Investment Scheme (for protected structures)
- Historic Structures Fund

Attendees had the opportunity to discuss their individual cases and queries with the relevant officials and experts, leading to valuable conversations around the revitalisation of vacant properties in Birr and the surrounding area.

Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme

Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD, announced on the 17th October the 2024/25 Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme (ORIS).

The 2024/25 ORIS funding provides for the development of new and existing outdoor recreational infrastructure in rural areas. This funding stream is targeted towards the development of our natural amenities such as our mountains, lakes, rivers, beaches, blue-ways, bogs, forest walks and upland areas. All projects must be shovel ready in order to be considered for the larger Measure 2 and 3 grants.

Expressions of Interest were sought from members of the public and community groups to come forward with any projects that might be applicable under ORIS. The closing date for submissions has now passed, Offaly County Council is pleased with the level of interest in the scheme. All Expressions of Interest are currently being evaluated.

As a brief outline, ORIS 2024/25 provides funding for Outdoor Recreational projects as follows:

Measure 1

- Small scale repair / development / promotion and marketing.
- Funding of up to €40,000 at a 90% rate of aid.

Measure 2

- Medium scale repair/upgrade and new trail/amenity development.
- Funding of up to €200,000 at a 90% rate of aid.

Measure 3

- Large scale repair/upgrade and new strategic trail/amenity development
- Funding of up to €500,000 at a 90% rate of aid

Project Development Measure

- Detailed development of projects which would enable them to reach a standard for application under Measure 2 or Measure 3 of ORIS.
- Funding of up to €50,000 at a 90% rate of aid.

Rural Regeneration Development Fund – Category 2

On the 29th November, Minister for Rural and Community Development, Heather Humphreys TD, launched the fourth Call for Category 2 applications under the Rural Regeneration and Development Fund (RRDF). This fund supports the goals of Our Rural Future, Rural Development Policy 2021-2025 and the Town Centre First policy by enabling transformative regeneration projects in rural towns with populations under 10,000.

RRDF provides funding for initiatives that drive economic activity, tackle vacancy and dereliction and improve infrastructure to create sustainable and vibrant rural communities. Category 2 funding focuses on the development phase of projects, helping them become "Category 1 ready" for large-scale capital investment.

Eligible projects may include addressing building vacancy, clustering community facilities, and enhancing public spaces to boost town centre development. Projects must align with the fund's objectives of promoting sustainable economic and social development through collaboration between government bodies, local authorities, communities, and private sector partners.

Offaly County Council is permitted to submit a maximum of two applications under this call and the regeneration section is currently assessing possible projects for submission.

Offaly Co-Working Hubs – The Junction, Tullamore

Offaly Innovation and Design Centre CLG recently completed significant renovations at 25J Axis Business Park, funded by the Just Transition Fund and Offaly County Council. The revamped space now includes nine new offices and a warehouse, with seven offices and the warehouse already rented out following a successful EOI.

This project has significantly boosted Tullamore and County Offaly's economic landscape by providing essential space for business startups, facilitating job creation, and fostering a vibrant business economy. The focus on low-carbon, digital economy enterprises supports regional development and reduces commuting times for employees.

OIDC continues to expand, offering hot desks, office space, training facilities, and meeting rooms. Its close connection to LEO Offaly attracts a diverse range of startups and remote workers, supporting jobs and communities throughout the county.

Tullamore Grand Canal Harbour Project update

The October Tullamore Municipal District meeting approved the final Tullamore Regeneration Framework and Grand Canal Harbour Master Plan, reviewed public consultation responses, and approved the SEA/AA reports presented by Orla Martin, Head of Enterprise in Offaly County Council. The first Grand Canal Harbour Steering Group meeting was held on 29th November.

Dream Big Programme

Offaly County Council and Offaly Local Enterprise Office supported the DREAM Big Programme from 11th to 15th November. This initiative, in collaboration with regional local authorities, TUS Athlone, and local industries, aimed to inspire and support young people in the Midlands to pursue careers in advanced manufacturing.

The programme, open to senior cycle students, offered visits to local manufacturing companies and hands-on activities aligned with DREAM (Digitalisation, Robotics, Engineering, Advanced Manufacturing, and Materials). The initiative provided students with insights into globally recognised products and the stories behind them. Sincere thanks to Grant Engineering and Applied Concepts who facilitated site visits to their premises during the week.

Rhode Green Energy Park

The Rhode Green Energy Park Implementation Framework Report, including a Tenant Charter, was completed in April 2024, followed by an updated site evaluation in June, leading to three applications for industrial sites by the October deadline. The applications were scored by an Evaluation Board, resulting in a provisional agreement to sell four sites, Applicants will now carry out initial due diligence site surveys, after which it is planned to finalise terms and conditions and before a public announcement with the new partnerships will be made. The park's logo and signage to be erected shortly.

LECP Implementation Plan 2024-2025

The Framework Local Economic and Community Plan (LECP) 2024-2029 was adopted by Offaly County Council on 20th May 2024 and the initial two-year Implementation Plan 2024-2025 was adopted by Offaly County Council on the 18th November 2024.

The Implementation Plan was developed following workshops held with key local agencies. It includes prioritised objectives, actions and outcomes which will be delivered over the coming years. A flexible approach will be taken, where actions and objectives will be reviewed regularly and updated where necessary.

Agencies and stakeholders will regularly report back on progress, but the most critical aspect of entire process is the effectiveness of the execution of the specific actions. Each action will be monitored on an ongoing basis by the LCDC and the Community, Economic and Climate Action SPC's.

Progress reports will be made by the LECP Advisory Steering Group twice yearly to the LCDC and to the relevant SPC's, in June and December. Issues arising will be actioned at the LCDC and SPC meetings and a summary report will be provided to the full Council once a year.

A Red, Amber Green assessment of progress will be made for each action and explanations and remedies will be provided where actions have not progressed sufficiently. **Further** Implementation Plans will be developed for 2026-2027 and 2028-2029 following review of initial Plan.

Local Enhancement Programme (LEP) 2025

LEP 2025 was launched on 7th November 2024. It is funded by the Department of Rural and Community Development and will be administered by Offaly Local Community Development Committee (LCDC). The national allocation is €7m and the allocation for Offaly amounts to €186,553 in total.

The LEP 2025 will open for applications from 15th January 2025, and the Closing date will be Wednesday 12th February 2025. Full details of how to apply will be published on the website www.offaly.ie and will be circulated to all Offaly PPN registered groups. Grants will be between €500 and €3,000 in size, with most grants being from €1,000 to €2,000. The total fund for Offaly is €186,553, which is split as follows:

Capital Expenditure €150,575 for small capital works/ scale repair and improvements to facilities, energy efficiency projects, purchase equipment, etc. The Department requests that LCDCs ring-fence 30% of its funding for grants of €1,000 or less.

Current Expenditure €26,650 for support with energy or running costs, e.g. rental/lease costs, utility bills, insurance costs. Energy/operating/costs must be incurred in the period 1st June 2024 to 30th May 2025 to be eligible.

HSE held a Consultation on the rise of selfharm behaviour on 28th November. HSE are willing to fund a project with the input of Offaly Comhairle na nÓg as the focus for 2025 will continue to be Mental Health.

The Youth Commissions enables artists to work with youth groups and communities to develop projects that will enable engagement between professional artists and young facilitated people (13+),by youth organisations, youth leaders and schools. The goal being to build secure relationships with relevant partners for the development of Youth Arts in the county. The voice of the young people is a priority for this programme.

Funding Opportunities


Offaly County Council Arts Office has opened its application process for a variety of grants offered to professional artists, communities, and festivals for 2025. Offaly County Council Arts Office offers a number of grant schemes to assist in the development and promotion of the Arts across the county. The grants include the Arts Acts Grants 2025, the Festival Arts Scheme 2025 and the Professional Artists Support Award 2025.



The Arts Acts Grants are community based and designed to support Offaly voluntary arts organisations, schools, drama & musical groups, town bands, voluntary community groups intending to host arts events, performances, or projects taking place in Offaly in 2025. The Festival Arts Scheme is designed for festivals taking place in Offaly in 2025 that are either dedicated arts festivals or have a strong professional arts element to the festival. The Professional Artist Support Award offers a support scheme for professional artists in developing their arts practice over a number of categories.

Collaborations Creative Places Edenderry

November 2024 Creative **Places** Edenderry published its Three Year Report which reflects on the first three years of the Creative Places, Edenderry Project, the theme of which was Cultivate, Connect, Celebrate. Creative



Places, Edenderry works with people of all ages and backgrounds to create a richer, more inclusive, and more cohesive creative community in the town and surrounding

areas. Over the course of the first three years of the project (2021-2024) there have been creative opportunities for professional artists, non-professional artists, community groups, and individuals.

Saibhreas - OCC Municipal Collection Exhibition in Esker Arts

Esker Arts

Esker Arts continued to be a hive of activity across the month of October with a range of workshops in a wide variety of artforms, as well as excellent local theatre. A sell out show for October was Roddy Doyle's *The Snapper* produced by Colin Hughes Promotions and a multimedia concert for all the family by The Whistleblast Quartet. Towards the end of the month Esker Arts were preparing for the Hullabaloo Children's Arts Festival for their younger audiences and the Eagla Fest 2024, with a line-up of bone-chilling films for the older audiences.

Birr Theatre and Arts Centre

Lough Boora Sculpture Park

The Arts Office funded by Creative Ireland and supported by Bord na Móna have commissioned a new maintenance programme for Lough Boora Sculpture Park to take place through 2024-2025. Artist Michael Burke, Sculpture Works, has carried out a review and report and works having been taking place throughout the summer.

Edenderry Library and Arts Base

The Arts Office continues to work in close collaboration with the county librarian in the development of plans for a multipurpose Arts space and Artist's Studios to be incorporated into the planning of the new library for Edenderry including the audience and participant development as part of the Creative Places Edenderry project.

In the aftermath of the Irish revolutionary period, the 1923 All-Ireland Junior Hurling Championship took place in Croke Park on the 12th October 1924.



On this day, Offaly claimed their first ever championship title with victory over Cork by a narrow margin of 2 points.

To commemorate Offaly's historic victory, Offaly Library Service produced an anthology of poetry and art created by 5th & 6th class students of Mercy Primary School, Birr, Scoil Phroinsiais Naofa, Clara, Monasterosis National School, Edenderry, and St. Colman's National School, Mucklagh
