Mr. Joe Coleman, SEE, Environment & Water Services, gave a progress report on Environment and Water Services sections addressing the following:

Tesco Site

District Director Sharon Kennedy informed the Members that the appointment of the design team for the new library is almost concluded. At an early stage, the Members will be consulted with regard to the design of the library prior to public consultation.

District Engineer Mark Mahon displayed the entire demolition process of the former Tesco building through a time-lapse video. Cllr. Cribbin complimented Hegarty's contractors for works carried out and expressed his excitement with what is to come in time for Edenderry. Cllr.
